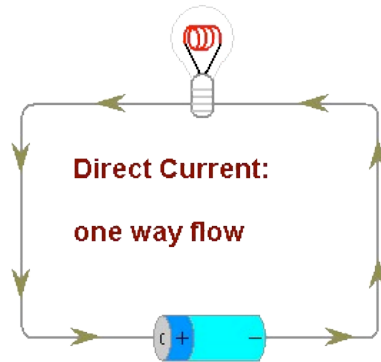
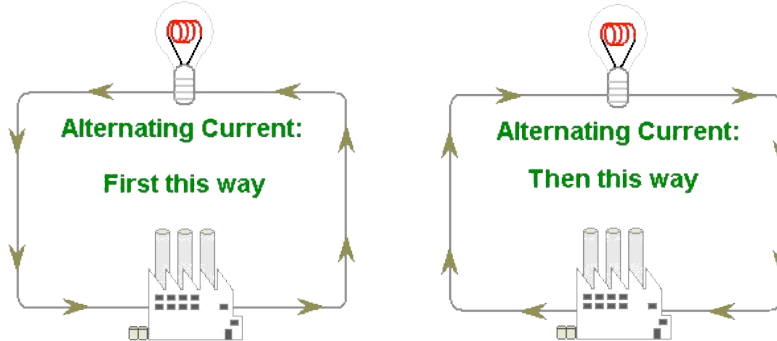


Types of Electrical Current

 - o An example of direct current is a _____. The battery has a set _____ (positive (+) and negative (-) terminals) and will produce an electric current in only one direction.



- _____ flows in both directions. First it flows in one direction, and then it reverses its flow to the opposite direction. There are no positive or negative polarity markings in alternating current because the polarity changes rapidly in the typical ac electrical circuit.
